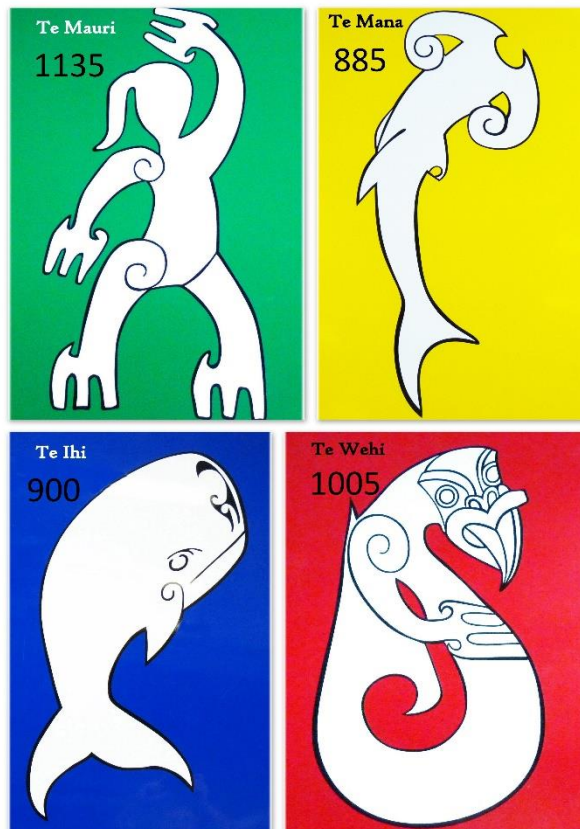

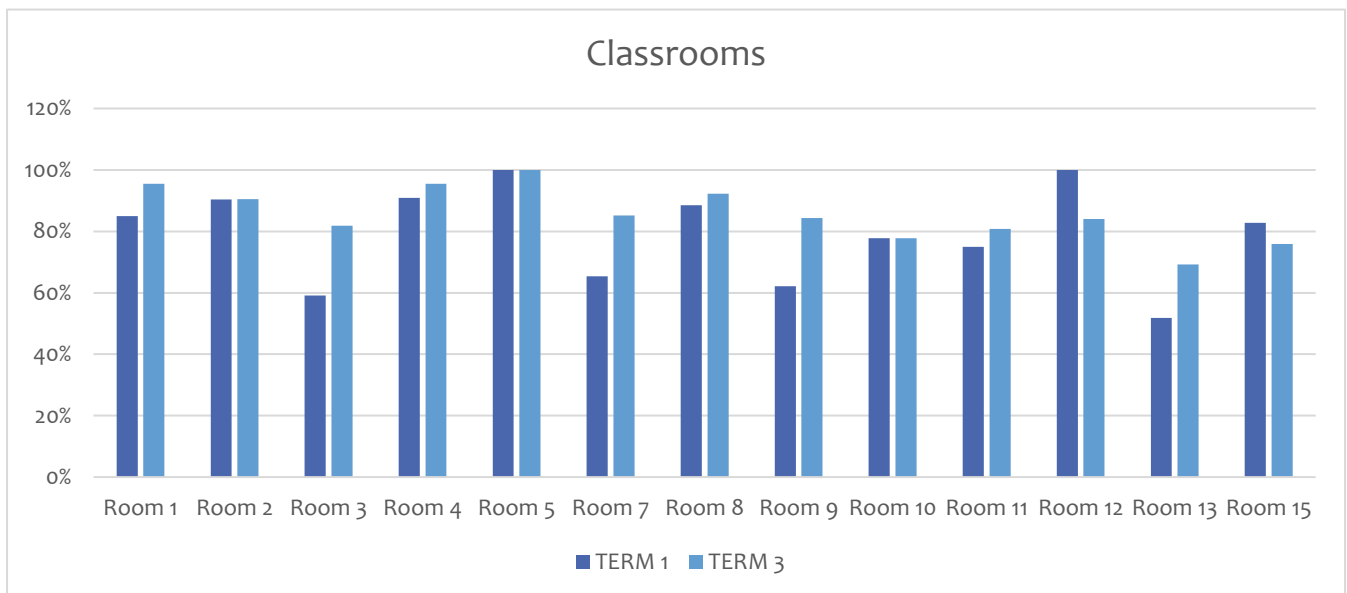
STUDENT LED CONFERENCES
