TERM ONE - WE ARE OFF AND SPRINTING!

I am sure you have noticed that TPI is a busy place! Already heading towards the end of week 5 we are nearly half way through the Term and already so many opportunities are underway.

It can be guite a hectic change for some of our new people and we do try really hard to help them adjust, be in the right place at the right time, developing some independence as they grow.

It can be helpful to have a little whiteboard or planner at home where you place the weekly events your child is involved in along with the gear they will require. A visual reminder is helpful to both the students and to the rest of the whānau to support your child.

Here at school, when the Panui - 'daily notices' are read via the radio each morning, students write into their radio book anything relevant to them and our teachers write them up on the board so students can double check where the meeting/practise is and what time.

If you feel your child has missed a notice or an opportunity, make contact with your teacher in the first instance and we can follow up to see if we can accommodate them.

UN-NAMED SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS

Every day we collect a pile of hats, sandals and jackets that are left around the school grounds and are not named.

Please, please, get a sharpie and name all your child's uniform items.

A silver sharpie works well on our dark clothing items and brilliantly in the inside of the hat and sandals.

Almost daily I hear that 'my sandals have been stolen' but in reality, they were left somewhere and someone else has picked them up by mistake because they were not named.

Hats – if a student does not have their hat and it is a hot sunny day, they are required to play/sit in the shade. No exceptions.

We try to be sensible and use our common sense with this rule if it's cloudy and the UV is lower then we relent and let everyone out on the field and astro.

VISITING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

In March we have 3 boys from Thailand visiting Te Puke for 3 weeks, attending TPI and being hosted by 3 families for this time. We are looking forward to sharing the Kiwi education system and lifestyle with these boys.
